## **Pastor's Piece**

It seems like 2021 is rushing us along. February is already here, and we are preparing for the season of Lent at Calvary. Last year, Ash Wednesday occurred at the end of February, and the coming lockdown hadn't happened yet. Later in March, we were not able to gather for our regular Sunday services, or for any other fellowship activities. The pandemic took Lent away from us just as it got going.

This year, we will celebrate Lent in the way we have become accustomed: livestream services and conference-call or zoom meetings. Our experience of limitation, of "restriction", that we have tolerated because of the pandemic is somehow a natural fit for the season of Lent. Lent has involved fasting, or "restriction", for centuries to help us prepare for the celebration of Holy Week and Easter.

The difference for us is that the restrictions we find ourselves negotiating today are not self-chosen or deliberate. They are mandated by circumstance. But for Christians who are serious about the "renewal of our minds" (Romans 12:2), maybe we can look at Lent this year as an opportunity? Instead of simply tolerating the restrictions we have to deal with, why not embrace them deliberately, in prayer? You don't have to like the situation. In fact, we might really be angry at the situation. But we can always wrap our feelings in honest, clearsighted prayer. Let us lift up our lives to our Lord Jesus Christ in prayer this Lent, and may his grace and peace fill our hearts.



Rich Bowman feels very blessed and honored to be able to share the Good News of

God's love for us in Jesus Christ with Calvary Lutheran Church. Rich grew up in a bi-lingual (English/Spanish) home in Baltimore and is the oldest of 3 brothers. His mom, who is from Peru still lives in Baltimore.

In 1989, Rich was ordained as a United Methodist Minister and served 2 churches in the Metropolitan Washington, DC area before moving to New York City in 1994 to attend law school. He maintains his ordination credentials with the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist



Church. Rich and his family became affiliated with the ELCA when they began attending Good Shepherd Church in Pearl River, NY in 2009.

He is currently Associate General Counsel at New York Life Insurance Company, where he has practiced regulatory, general corporate, and securities law for over 20 years. He is also dad to 3 teenagers: Nick, age 19 and a second year student at Drexel University; Sophia, age 18 and a first year student at New York University, and Daniel, age 16, a high school junior.

Rich earned a *Bachelor of Arts* from the University of Maryland, a *Master of Divini*ty from Boston University, and a *Juris Doctor* from Fordham University School of Law.



### Ms. Kara Song

Kara was born in South Korea and immigrated to the U.S. as a toddler in the early 1970s. She was raised in Georgia, where her father planted two Korean Presbyterian churches.

She graduated from Emory University with a BA in Sociology & Music, received a Master of Public Administration from Georgia State University, and is currently enrolled in Drew Theological Seminary's

She has worked in various social service and nonprofit/governmental sector positions in Georgia, Oregon, California, Connecticut, and is currently a Contract Administrator with the State of NJ-Dept. of Children & Families.

Kara has served in a variety of positions in Protestant denominations in mainly Korean-American congregations in Atlanta, San Jose, Los Angeles, Portland (OR), Springfield (MA), Wayne & Woodland Park (NJ). She currently attends Grace United Methodist Church (Wyckoff), where she is a Lay Delegate to the Greater NJ UMC Annual Conference, Church Council Recording Secretary, Staff/Parish Relations Committee, contemporary Praise Band and Handbells Choir member.

Kara views herself, not as the stereotypical Asian "Tiger Mom," but more like a "Panda Mom" (laying around, eating potstickers)… to her fun sons, Kyle (19), Ryan (16), and adopted canine son, Phoenix (9 mos).

#### Rev. Wayne Jack Plumstead

Rev. Wayne Jack Plumstead is a retired clergyman of the United Methodist Church. He served pastorates in Bayonne, Kearny and Jersey City before becoming Senior Pastor at the Park United Methodist Church in Bloomfield for twenty years. He was appointed in 2011 by his bishop to serve as District Superintendent of the Palisades District where he supervised 80 churches and 86 pastors in Bergen County, northern Passaic County and Rockland County, New York. #### Definition

Lent is the forty-day season (excluding Sundays) of penitence and preparation for the Three Days of Holy Week and Easter.

#### A Very Brief History

The term "Lent" originally comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten" which means "spring." This is the time, in the Northern Hemisphere, when the days are lengthening. The season began as period of fasting leading up to the Vigil of Easter. Catechumens, those preparing for baptism at Easter, would fast and spend days in intense preparation. For those that were already baptized, Lent was a period to be renewed in their faith by studying the Bible, the Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

Although it was originally only a two-day period of preparation, Lent became a three-week preparatory period in the middle of the fourth century and then this was further expanded into six-weeks, or forty days. By the end of the fifth century, there was a desire to exclude Sundays from Lent since Sundays are always celebrated as feasts of the Resurrection. Thus Lent begins not on Sunday, but on Ash Wednesday.

The current practice of forty days of Lent recall Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness after his Baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) as well as Moses' forty-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28).
